Hello Everyone,

Hope you're keeping well and are looking forward to the restrictions easing, maybe in a few weeks. Despite us expecting we would be released into freedom in June to have more contact with others and resume some of our group activities, this was not the case. Because of an increase in cases of the COVID19 Delta variant there has been a four week pause - we are now hopeful that by July 19th maybe these restrictions will be eased. Of course at present we can still meet in groups of six in restaurants, six or two households indoors, and up to 30 outdoors, but let's keep ourselves and others safe. Learning to live with the challenges ahead is something we will need to do. The priority for Lewisham is to ensure everyone, certainly 70%, have had their double vaccines, and there is an open door for anyone over 23 to receive these. We have become used to being patient and adaptable over the last 16 months, I feel, and have lowered our expectations; some have got so used to this more limited way of living that they actually fear resuming activities, while others are chomping at the bit to break free.

The Gospel on Sunday spoke of Jesus calming the turbulent raging waters, and the hearts and minds of his disciples, reminding us that Jesus is with us always to calm our inner turmoil and fears and to help stop us feeling overwhelmed by life's challenges.

Last week I was lucky enough to be able to visit my homeland of Wales for a few days, cliff walking and swimming in the freezing Irish sea in the drizzle, and then onto Colyton in Devon, staying in a B&B in beautiful countryside. The weather was glorious and I was able to visit the pretty seaside town of Sidmouth, where I visited the donkey sanctuary looking after hundreds of donkeys. One of our Bring Me Sunshine recipients, Kitty, knits donkeys that get sold in their gift shop to help fund the work of the sanctuary, which is free for visits but relies on donations.

Bring Me Sunshine hopes to arrange some events when able - one will be an afternoon tea in the Catford & Cyphers cricket ground, Rubens St, SE6. Because restrictions are continuing the date proposed is now the 3rd August.

As well as this, I hope the Diamond Club can resume again in the very near future. I have even pencilled in a coach trip to Eastbourne if allowed in August, as I know many of you are keen to see the sea.

We also hope to join Goldsmiths community centre on the weekend of the 31st July for their summer festival fundraiser, on Saturday and Sunday 10-4. We hope to have some stalls to sell items and host some activities to raise money for our projects. More news on these to follow once we get the green light.


Most of you have received a song on your doorstep by now, but coming soon will be a dance on your doorstep from a project *Traceworks*. Let me know if you would like to receive one.

Scripture Cake, Second version:

4½cups 1st Kings 4:22 (flour)

1½ cups Judges 5:25 (butter)

2 cups Jeremiah 6:20 (sugar)

2 cups 1st Samuel 30:12 (raisins)

2 cups Nahum 3:12 (figs, chopped)

1 cup Numbers 17:8 (almonds, blanched and chopped)

2 tablespoons 1st Samuel 14:25 (honey)

Seasoning to taste of 2nd Chronicles 9:9 (spices, eg cinnamon, nutmeg)

6 cups Jeremiah 17:11 (eggs)

Pinch Leviticus 2:13 (salt)

½ cup Judges 4:19 (milk)

2 teaspoons Amos 4:5 (leavening agent eg baking soda)

Method:

With Judges 5:25 and Jeremiah 6:20, follow Solomon's prescription for making a good child – Proverbs 23:14 (beat)

Add 1st Samuel 14:25 then the rest of your dry scripture passages and finally Judges 4:19






